



## Learning Exploration: How do we change?

At this point in their lives, children are aware of their immediate family and those that care for them. Through this exploration, they will explore the following:

- How they have grown from a baby into who they are today and how the things they could do as a baby and what they can do now are different.
- They will explore their family and how families can be similar or different to each other.
- They will look at how people change over time and how this links to their own family.
- The children will look to learn about their peers and how they are similar and different to them. This may be within the goals and aspirations they have for the future.
