



Learning Exploration: Salty and Fresh

Newport is located just a few miles from where the River Taw meets the open ocean. We live in an area with many beaches and access to open water and through this topic, the children will learn how the rivers and oceans around us provide habitats for different creatures as well as how these different areas are important to local communities. We will consider the following:

- How have the rivers/oceans changed over time? Have they always been there?
- Are the rivers and oceans in North Devon used by people in the same way they are used across the world?
- How are the beaches/ivers different from the areas in which we live?
- How are the rivers/oceans treated by humans? What can we do to make positive change?

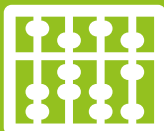
Maths
